## Take a stroll along the river

### Pleasure Grounds (10 minutes)

A hop, skip and a jump along the Thames path brings you to this relaxing riverside park.

### Lucy Fisher River Boat Trips\* (10 minutes)

All aboard for a cruise on the River Thames! Travel past some of England's finest landmarks with unrivalled views! Offering hourly trips from 11.30am to 4.30pm on weekends from Easter to September. Speak to our reception team for more details.

### Magna Carta Memorial (40 minutes)

A careful leap across the Windsor Road or a walk along the river will lead you up to the National Trust estate. Here you will find the Magna Carta Memorial where King John met his barons on 15th June in 1215 and agreed to seal the Magna Carta that was to have a profound influence on rights and freedoms, not only in England, but across much of the civilised world.

### The Jurors (40 minutes)

These twelve intricately worked bronze chairs by Hew Locke incorporate imagery representing key moments in the struggle for freedom, rule of law and equal rights. Situated in the meadow opposite the Magna Carta Memorial, this piece sits naturally in Runnymede, the birthplace of modern democracy.

### Writ In Water (40 minutes)

Set in the heart of this ancient landscape, Writ in Water reflects upon the founding principles of democracy, and through a meeting of water, sky and light, provides visitors with a space for reflection and contemplation.

### JFK Memorial (40 minutes)

Just further along from The Magna Carta Memorial, and up a path of granite steps, you will find a little piece of America, and the memorial to the assassinated American President John F. Kennedy.

### Magna Carta Tea Room (40 minutes)

Stay refreshed with a visit to the Magna Carta Tea Room, serving a range of hot and cold drinks, light meals and snacks. With indoor and outdoor seating, you can enjoy a cosy cuppa inside or make the most of the meadow views.

## 10-15 minutes by car

### The Savill Gardens

Situated within the royal landscape of Windsor Great Park, The Savill Gardens never fails to charm visitors who explore its breathtaking 35 acres of classically designed gardens and woodland. Each 'garden within a garden' has its own attractions; are ever changing; and evoke a delightful expression of British horticulture.

### Virginia Water Lake

Roman ruins and totem poles are just some of the sights to be seen around the lakes of Virginia Water. Grab a picnic, go for a bike ride, peer over the waterfall and enjoy a thoroughly English day out.

### Everyman Cinema, Egham

## 20-25 minutes by car

### Ascot Racecourse

Established in 1711 by Queen Anne, Ascot Racecourse has been the centre piece of British horse racing for the past three centuries. Synonymous with quality, style and excellence tickets are available throughout the calendar year. Take a bet, sip some champagne and have a sporting day out.

### Eton College

Explore the halls of one of the most exclusive educational establishments in the world. With 19 former British Prime Ministers numbered among the former pupils, there are few other educational establishments in the UK as steeped in tradition and history as Eton College.

### Dorney Lake

A stone's throw from the River Thames, Dorney Lake is a 2,200 metre flat water rowing lake owned by Eton College. A variety of rowing events can be experienced throughout the year. Predominantly used for international regattas and triathlons, Eton Dorney also played host to the rowing events for the 2012 London Olympics and Paralympics.

### Sunningdale Golf Course

Lined with enchanting woodlands and awe inspiring views from elevated tees, Sunningdale Golf course is widely considered to be one of the most stunning and testing courses in the UK. Tee off at Sunningdale all year round, Monday through to Thursday.

### Allianz Stadium, Twickenham
